NOTES

1. GENERAL

The Company was incorporated in the Cayman Islands as an exempted company with limited liability on 8 April 2016. Its shares (the "Shares") are listed on GEM of the Stock Exchange on 15 March 2017. The address of the Company's registered office is Cricket Square, Hutchins Drive, P.O. Box 2681, Grand Cayman KY1-1111, Cayman Islands and its principal place of business in Hong Kong is Room A4, 2/F., Tsim Sha Tsui Mansion, 83–87 Nathan Road, Kowloon, Hong Kong.

The Company is an investment holding company. The Group is principally engaged in trading, installation and renting of suspended working platforms and other construction equipment.

2. BASIS OF PRESENTATION AND PREPARATION

The unaudited consolidated financial statements of the Group for the three months ended 30 June 2023 (the "Unaudited Consolidated Financial Statements") have been prepared in accordance with the Hong Kong Financial Reporting Standards (the "HKFRSs") issued by the Hong Kong Institute of Certified Public Accountants (the "HKICPA") and the applicable disclosure requirements of the GEM Listing Rules.

The accounting policies and methods of computation used in the preparation of the Unaudited Consolidated Financial Statements are consistent with those used in the annual financial statements of the Group for the year ended 31 March 2023.

The HKICPA has issued a number of new and revised HKFRSs. For those which are relevant to the Group's operations and effective for its accounting period beginning 1 April 2023, the adoption has no significant changes on the Group's accounting policies as well as the presentation, the reported results and the financial position of the Group for the current or prior accounting periods.

The Group has not applied the new and revised HKFRSs which have been issued but are not yet effective. The Group is currently in the process of making an assessment of the impact of these new and revised HKFRSs but is not yet in a position to state whether they would have a material impact on the Group's results and financial position.

The Unaudited Consolidated Financial Statements have been prepared under the historical cost basis.

2. BASIS OF PRESENTATION AND PREPARATION (CONTINUED)

The preparation of the unaudited consolidated financial statements in conformity with the HKFRSs requires management to make judgements, estimates and assumptions that affect the application of policies and reported amounts of assets, liabilities, income and expenses. The estimates and associated assumptions are based on historical experience and various other factors that are believed to be reasonable under the circumstances, the results of which form the basis of making the judgements about the carrying value of assets and liabilities that are not readily apparent from other sources. Actual results may differ from these estimates. The Unaudited Consolidated Financial Statements should be read in conjunction with the Group's audited consolidated financial statements and notes thereto for the year ended 31 March 2023.

The estimates and underlying assumptions are reviewed on an ongoing basis. Revisions to accounting estimates are recognized in the period in which the estimate is revised if the revision affects only that period, or in the period of the revision and future periods if the revision affects both current and future periods.

The consolidated financial statements for the three months ended 30 June 2023 have not been audited by the Company's independent auditor, but have been reviewed by the audit committee of the Board (the "Audit Committee").

The Unaudited Consolidated Financial Statements are presented in Hong Kong dollars ("HK\$") which is also the functional currency of the Group, and all values are rounded to the nearest thousands, except when otherwise indicated.

3. REVENUE

Revenue, which is also the Group's turnover, represents income received and receivable from rental and related services and trading of equipment and spare parts during the three months ended 30 June 2023 and is summarised as follows:

Hong Kong Profits Tax

Under the two-tiered profits tax rates regime, one of the subsidiaries of the Company is subject to Hong Kong profits tax at the rate of 8.25% for the first HK\$2 million of estimated assessable profits and at 16.5% on the estimated assessable profits above HK\$2 million. Other subsidiaries of the Company are subject to Hong Kong profits tax at the rate of 16.5% for the three months ended 30 June 2023 and 30 June 2022, respectively.

Income tax from other tax jurisdictions

Pursuant to the rules and regulations of the Cayman Islands and the British Virgin Islands, the Group is not subject to any income tax in the respective tax jurisdictions.

The calculation of basic earnings per share is based on the profit attributable to the owners of the Company for the three months ended 30 June 2023 of approximately HK\$3,626,000 (2022: approximately HK\$4,159,000) and the weighted average number of ordinary shares of 376,000,000 (2022: 400,000,000) in issue during the period.

Diluted earnings per share were the same as the basic earnings per share as there were no dilutive ordinary shares in existence during the three months ended 30 June 2023 and 2022.

MANAGEMENT DISCUSSION AND ANALYSIS

BUSINESS REVIEW AND OUTLOOK

Our Group is principally engaged in (i) providing rental services of temporary suspended working platforms and other equipment, mainly including tower cranes and generators; and (ii) trading of equipment and spare parts, mainly including permanent suspended working platforms, motors and wire rope.

RENTAL AND RELATED SERVICES

Our Group has been providing temporary suspended working platforms, tower cranes and generators to our customers for housing construction or repair and refurbishment purposes. We also provide related services in installation, dismantling, commissioning, servicing, maintaining, jacking up or down, inspection service and transportation of tower cranes.

TRADING OF EQUIPMENT AND SPARE PARTS

With our established customer and supplier base, we also engage in the trading of equipment and spare parts, mainly including permanent suspended working platforms, motors and wire rope, predominantly in Hong Kong which further enhances our capability to satisfy customers' demands. We source our equipment and spare parts from suppliers mainly located in Germany, Belgium, Spain, Singapore and China, and sell them mainly to construction contractors and trading companies in Hong Kong.

Looking forward, drawing on our Group's extensive expertise, our Group will strive to lead the temporary suspended working platform and tower crane industry with the offer of our high-quality equipment and premium service and will also seize emerging opportunities in the growing equipment rental industry.

For the long-term and diversified development of our Group, we have been exploring other business opportunities in the construction industry in Hong Kong, in an attempt to create greater sustainable returns for our shareholders.

FINANCIAL REVIEW

Revenue

Our Group recorded an increase in revenue for the three months ended 30 June 2023, which increased by approximately 26.6% to approximately HK\$32.2 million as compared with revenue of approximately HK\$25.4 million for the three months ended 30 June 2022. The increase was mainly due to an increase in income generated from tower crane rental and related service.

Cost of sales and services rendered

Our Group's cost of sales and services rendered amounted to approximately HK\$19.4 million for the three months ended 30 June 2023, representing an increase of approximately 6.5% (2022: approximately HK\$18.2 million). Cost of sales and services rendered mainly represents the cost of inventories sold and materials consumed, subcontracting fee, staff costs, rental of equipment and depreciation. The increase was in line with the increase in revenue for the three months ended 30 June 2023.

Gross profit and gross profit margin

Gross profit of the Group increased by approximately 77.7% from approximately HK\$7.2 million for the three months ended 30 June 2022 to approximately HK\$12.8 million for the three months ended 30 June 2023. Such increase was mainly due to an increase in revenue during the period. The gross profit margin of the Group increased from approximately 28.3% for the three months ended 30 June 2022 to approximately 39.7% for the three months ended 30 June 2023 mainly due to the higher profit margin from tower crane rental and related service as compared to the corresponding period last year.

Other income

Our Group recognised other income of approximately HK\$441,000 and approximately HK\$891,000 for the three months ended 30 June 2022 and 2023, respectively. The amount mainly represents the recovery of impairment loss on account receivable of approximately HK\$850,000 in the three months ended 30 June 2023 (2022: Income received from anti-epidemic fund subsidy scheme of approximately HK\$248,000 and exchange gain of approximately HK\$165,000).

Administrative expenses

Our administrative expenses increased significantly by approximately HK\$6.0 million or 219.5% from approximately HK\$2.7 million for the three months ended 30 June 2022 to approximately HK\$8.8 million for the three months ended 30 June 2023. The increase was mainly attributable to the increase in salaries and performance bonus paid to directors of approximately HK\$3.3 million and depreciation of property, plant and equipment of approximately HK\$1.8 million for the three months ended 30 June 2023.

Finance costs

Our finance costs remain stable at approximately HK\$377,000 for the three months ended 30 June 2023 (2022 : approximately HK\$368,000).

Profit and total comprehensive income for the period

Our Group's profit and total comprehensive income decreased by approximately 12.8% from approximately HK\$4.2 million for the three months ended 30 June 2022 to approximately HK\$3.6 million for the three months ended 30 June 2023. The decrease was mainly due to an increase in income tax expense for the three months ended 30 June 2023.

CORPORATE GOVERNANCE PRACTICES

Code provision C.2.1 of the Corporate Governance Code contained in Appendix 15 to the GEM Listing Rules (the "CG Code") stipulates that the roles of chairman and chief executive should be separate and should not be performed by the same individual. Mr. Tang Hing Keung is the chairman of our Board and the chief executive officer of the Company. In view of the fact that Mr. Tang Hing Keung is one of the co-founders of our Group and has been operating and managing our Group since its establishment in 1997, all the other Directors believe that the vesting of the roles of chairman and chief executive officer in Mr. Tang Hing Keung is beneficial to the business operations and management of our Group and will provide a strong and consistent leadership to our Group. Mr. Tang Hing Keung provides leadership to the Company and is responsible for strategic planning and the overall management and supervision of operations of our Group. As all major decisions are made in consultation with the members of the Board, and there are three independent non-executive Directors on the Board offering independent advices, the Board is of the view that there are adequate safeguards in place to ensure sufficient balance of powers and authority within the Board. Accordingly, the Company has not segregated the roles of its chairman and chief executive officer as required by the said code provision. The Board will continue to review and monitor the practices of our Company for the purpose of complying with the CG Code and maintaining a high standard of corporate governance practices of our Company.

Save for the deviation from code provision C.2.1 as mentioned above, the Board is satisfied that the Company had complied with all the code provisions of the CG Code during the three months ended 30 June 2023.

SHARE OPTION SCHEME

The Company's share option scheme (the "Share Option Scheme") was adopted pursuant to a resolution of the sole shareholder passed on 23 February 2017 for the purpose of providing incentives or rewards to eligible persons whom the Board considers, in its sole discretion, to have contributed or will contribute to our Group. The terms of the Share Option Scheme are in accordance with the provisions of Chapter 23 of the GEM Listing Rules.

As no share option has been granted since the adoption of the Share Option Scheme, there was no share option outstanding as at 30 June 2023 and no options were exercised or cancelled or lapsed during the three months ended 30 June 2023.

COMPETING BUSINESS

During the three months ended 30 June 2023, the Directors were not aware of any business or interest of the Directors, the controlling shareholders of the Company and their respective close associates (as defined in the GEM Listing Rules) that had competed or might compete with the business of our Group and any other conflicts of interests which any such person had or might have with our Group.

PURCHASE, SALE OR REDEMPTION

Neither our Company nor any member of our Group purchased, sold or redeemed any of the listed securities of our Company during the three months ended 30 June 2023.

SECURITIES TRANSACTIONS BY DIRECTORS

Our Company has adopted the required standard of dealings in the securities (the "Required Standard of Dealings") as contained in Rules 5.48 to 5.67 of the GEM Listing Rules as its own code of conduct governing the securities transactions by the Directors. Following a specific enquiry made by our Company on each of the Directors, all Directors have confirmed that they have complied with the Required Standard of Dealings during the three months ended 30 June 2023.

PRINCIPAL RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES

Our Group's financial condition, results of operations, businesses and prospects would be affected by a number of risks and uncertainties. All the risks relating to our Group's business have been set out in the section headed "Risk Factors" in the prospectus of the Company dated 28 February 2017.

IMPORTANT EVENTS AFTER THE REPORTING PERIOD

Save as disclosed in this report, the Board is not aware of any material event requiring disclosure that has taken place subsequent to 30 June 2023 and up to the date of this report.

AUDIT COMMITTEE

The Company has established an audit committee since 23 February 2017 with written terms of reference in compliance with code provision D.3.3 of the CG Code and Rules 5.28 to 5.33 of the GEM Listing Rules. The primary duties of the Audit Committee are, among other things, to make recommendations to the Board on the appointment, re-appointment and removal of external auditors and to review and supervise the financial reporting process, risk management and internal control systems of the Group. The Audit Committee currently comprises three independent non-executive Directors, namely Mr. Chiu Chi Wing, Mr. Kwan Woon Man Boris and Mr. Yeung Chi Fai. Mr. Chiu Chi Wing is the chairman of the Audit Committee. The Audit Committee has reviewed the Unaudited Consolidated Financial Statements and this report and is of the view that such statements have been prepared in compliance with the applicable accounting standards, the GEM Listing Rules and other applicable legal requirements, and that adequate disclosure has been made.
